- Clinicians will not accept friend requests or engage in social media interactions with current clients to uphold confidentiality and professionalism.

Gifts and Personal Relationships:

- Acceptance of gifts by clinicians is discouraged, and personal relationships outside of the therapeutic setting are strictly prohibited to maintain objectivity and professionalism.

Physical Contact:

- Physical contact between the clinician and client is limited to professional gestures such as handshakes and is always initiated with the client's consent.

Dual Relationships:

- Avoidance of dual relationships is crucial. Clinicians will not engage in any relationship that could compromise the therapeutic alliance.

Termination of Therapy:

- The termination of therapy is conducted professionally, and any potential post-termination relationships are carefully considered and discussed.

Crisis Situations:

- In crisis situations, the clinician's primary role is to provide support within the therapeutic framework. Personal involvement beyond the professional scope is strictly avoided.
